5034. SHRI BRIJENDRA SINGH:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the National Rural Drinking Water Programme is meeting its desired objectives in Haryana;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (c) the efforts made by the Government to provide drinking water in all the rural areas of Haryana by the year 2024, district-wise?

ANSWER

(a) to (c) Under erstwhile National Rural Drinking Water Programme (NRDWP), now subsumed under the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), objective was to make provision of potable water in rural habitations with minimum 40 litre per capita per day (lpcd) and drinking water source at a reasonable distance. As reported by Haryana State, as on 22.03.2021, 98.17% rural habitations having 97.74% rural population have provision of minimum 40 litre per capita per day (lpcd) and 1.83% rural habitations having 2.26% rural population have service level of less than 40 lpcd potable water supply.

Government of India, in partnership with States, is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission to provide tap water supply to every rural household in the country by 2024. As reported by States/ UTs, as on date, about 7.15 Crore (37.28%) rural households in the country have tap water supply. In Haryana, out of 31.03 lakh rural households, 26.88 lakh (86.63%) have tap water supply. Under JJM, the Haryana State has planned to provide tap water supply to every rural households by December, 2022.
